Everybody, this is a militia meeting for June 2026 for the Nevada Assembly.

The title of this presentation is Jurisdiction is the Battle Line, and that will become clear as to why shortly.

So we've already had a couple of militia meetings on jurisdiction, and there's a reason for that.

It's very important, particularly for the militia, to have a clear understanding of how that works.

So is there anybody who wants to read this or maybe it's kind of confusing and I'll just do it.

So this meeting is private, bearing false witness misrepresentation and posting inflammatory rhetoric in public forums is strictly forbidden and shall be addressed in an appropriate manner.

Anyone who is here under false pretenses, anyone who is working for any foreign government, including the territorial United States or municipal United States, anyone who is being paid or coerced to be here, must fully disclose their presence and purpose now or leave this conference call.

And we'll go for a third time.

Failure to disclose will result in discreditation.

As a federal witness, this protection applies to all members and ensures the integrity of the assembly.

So we always open with this, the well-being and security of the people.

That's our

Priority and purpose here, the assembly militia represents the collective desires and commitment of the people.

Sitting back and waiting for others to do the work will not achieve the desired outcome.

Every member must actively share in this effort.

Confident, prosperous, resilient, and secure, that this is a state we strive to achieve.

Defending these ideas peacefully is our highest purpose and primary mandate going forward.

We are a community of like-minded people.

00:02:36 Speaker 1

None of us can do this alone.

00:02:37 Speaker 1

Bring your talents, skills, and insight to the table for the benefit of all.

Unity of purpose is our greatest strength and the foundation upon which a sovereign assembly endures.

All right, let's get into the meat of this thing.

So why are we talking about this?

00:02:58 Speaker 1

Well,

00:03:00 Speaker 1

We've got some activity going on outside of our jurisdictional boundary that we all need to be aware of.

You may be hearing about the Clark County faction now calling itself the Nevada Assembly Unincorporated, with the Federation apparently appearing to back it.

Tonight, we look at it clearly and calmly, not with alarm, but with an analytical tools we've already built together.

This is jurisdiction applied.

00:03:30 Speaker 1

We talked in our previous militia presentations on jurisdiction about how jurisdiction is constructed.

00:03:38 Speaker 1

This is going to be an example of how jurisdiction is applied.

00:03:43 Speaker 1

This ties straight to the jurisdiction work that we've done before.

00:03:47 Speaker 1

We taught the principle there.

00:03:48 Speaker 1

Tonight, we applied it to a live situation.

00:03:52 Speaker 1

By the end, you will be able to explain this to any member who's confused.

And you'll see why none of it reaches us.

So you shouldn't be freaked out about this.

00:04:04 Speaker 1

It's really not that big a deal, honestly.

00:04:09 Speaker 1

So we've got these layers of jurisdiction.

00:04:13 Speaker 1

The primary layer is the seated assembly.

00:04:17 Speaker 1

That's us.

00:04:19 Speaker 1

We are the sovereign union state.

00:04:22 Speaker 1

The elected officials and the vetted

00:04:25 Speaker 1

assembled people of Nevada.

00:04:28 Speaker 1

This is the durable structure, and the seat is occupied.

00:04:34 Speaker 1

It has been continuously seated since 2019 with vetted members, recorded officers, and documents of record.

00:04:43 Speaker 1

This is established fact.

00:04:46 Speaker 1

There's nothing ambiguous about it.

00:04:49 Speaker 1

Layer 2, Federation Appointments.

00:04:52 Speaker 1

We've got a state coordinator in Sue.

00:04:53 Speaker 1

We've got Doug as a marshal at arms.

00:04:56 Speaker 1

We've got a PKTF liaison in Jennifer Olson.

00:04:59 Speaker 1

These are provisional roles that sunset.

00:05:02 Speaker 1

They fill federation jobs.

00:05:05 Speaker 1

They do not represent the assembly ever.

00:05:08 Speaker 1

Their authority is advisory and temporary, not governing.

00:05:14 Speaker 1

Layer three are the external bodies, the federation, the PKTF, the continental marshals.

00:05:21 Speaker 1

They all speak to Nevada, speak with Nevada.

00:05:25 Speaker 1

They do not govern it.

00:05:27 Speaker 1

None of the layer two or three sits above the assembly.

00:05:31 Speaker 1

The militia is made-up of the assembly members and answers to the assembly alone.

00:05:43 Speaker 1

The Federation does not run the state.

00:05:46 Speaker 1

It's a root error.

00:05:48 Speaker 1

The faction that's declaring themselves an independent state believes the Federation runs Nevada, and that what the Federation says goes.

00:05:58 Speaker 1

That belief is backwards.

00:06:00 Speaker 1

Nevada is a freestanding sovereign union state.

00:06:02 Speaker 1

Authority runs from the people to the elected assembly, not from the Federation downward to the state.

00:06:12 Speaker 1

The Federation is a service organization, not a government.

00:06:19 Speaker 1

and the coordination structure.

00:06:23 Speaker 1

No one in it is elected by anyone on Nevada, and none of it sits above the Assembly.

00:06:30 Speaker 1

Mistaking a service body for a government authority is the foundational error that drives every subsequent confusion in this faction's claims.

00:06:40 Speaker 1

So the folks that are calling themselves the Nevada Assembly Unincorporated

00:06:45 Speaker 1

are making a big mistake.

00:06:46 Speaker 1

They don't have any kind of jurisdictional ground to make that claim.

00:06:54 Speaker 1

So let's talk about what a coordinator is.

00:06:56 Speaker 1

A coordinator is an advisor whose job has been, always will be, to help the assembly stand on its own.

00:07:06 Speaker 1

The role is federation provided, provisional, and part of the federation, not the state.

00:07:13 Speaker 1

Its purpose is self-liquidating.

00:07:16 Speaker 1

Success of the assembly means that we don't need it any longer.

00:07:23 Speaker 1

So these positions are all temporary.

00:07:25 Speaker 1

They're designed to be supportive structures that we can utilize in order to formulate our assembly activity.

00:07:33 Speaker 1

And we've done that.

00:07:38 Speaker 1

The inversion

00:07:39 Speaker 1

Here's the other issue.

00:07:40 Speaker 1

A Federation-appointed county coordinator is claiming state authority.

00:07:45 Speaker 1

A self-styled state coordinator was installed by a faction vote without Sue, the Federation's own state coordinator, ever even being informed.

00:07:59 Speaker 1

So on, I believe, let me check my notes here, it was May 30th.

00:08:08 Speaker 1

There was a meeting that they had in Clark County, and they said the first part was a union state meeting, and the second part was a Nevada State Assembly meeting.

00:08:20 Speaker 1

And it was moderated or chaired, I don't know how they determine it down there, by Tamara Amaro, who they say now runs the state portion of these meetings as a state coordinator.

00:08:37 Speaker 1

Well,

00:08:38 Speaker 1

I don't recall anybody coming forward to our assembly to become a coordinator and go through our state vetting.

00:08:45 Speaker 1

We've done this before.

00:08:47 Speaker 1

The federation has every right to appoint their federation coordinators, any way they see fit.

00:08:56 Speaker 1

But the coordinators don't have any authority of any kind anywhere at all and never have.

00:09:03 Speaker 1

The vetting category error that they fell into is

00:09:07 Speaker 1

by their own documents, they show this new coordinator's vetting was via the Continental Marshals vetting.

00:09:13 Speaker 1

The Continental Marshals vetting has always been a secondary vetting process that we have sometimes accessed.

00:09:20 Speaker 1

They stopped doing it for a while.

00:09:23 Speaker 1

But it was always for international work.

00:09:26 Speaker 1

That's what they do.

00:09:28 Speaker 1

So their vetting system is set up to determine whether or not somebody is appropriate to do international work, which I suppose

00:09:37 Speaker 1

A coordinator might be invited along on some kind of international activity, but it's not the coordinator's job to do that.

00:09:46 Speaker 1

Even the federation itself, most recently, the person who runs the land recording office, said that she and Anna were in complete agreement that vetting occurs on the state and that continental marshals vetting is a supplementary vetting that is optional.

00:10:06 Speaker 1

So it is not the foundation for anybody claiming some kind of state assembly role.

00:10:17 Speaker 1

There we go.

00:10:17 Speaker 1

So on May 30th, faction meeting declared, we are the Nevada Assembly, by show of hands, conceded Tamara Amaral.

00:10:27 Speaker 1

I hope I'm not destroying that name there.

00:10:30 Speaker 1

Sorry about that if I am.

00:10:32 Speaker 1

as its own state coordinator, her first meeting in the role, no prior process, no established vetting, no record mandate.

00:10:41 Speaker 1

The name that it took, it now styles itself as the Nevada Assembly Unincorporated, declared its own courts and offices ready, and plans to notice the de facto.

00:10:55 Speaker 1

The name itself is a problem, more on that in a moment.

00:11:00 Speaker 1

There was Federation encouragement on this.

00:11:03 Speaker 1

On June 4th in the countrywide call, Anna praised the move as brilliant, a brilliant conclusion, and urged other states to follow that same garden path.

00:11:15 Speaker 1

This is a Federation backing an unsanctioned claim against the seated assembly.

00:11:20 Speaker 1

I'm not trying to create conflict here.

00:11:23 Speaker 1

I am trying to establish the factual record.

00:11:31 Speaker 1

They've decided to create their own recording office in a motion to make their five recording secretaries state recorders, none vetted by the cedar assembly, and to let Rocky buy their supplies and seals, which we've already noticed them not to use.

00:11:47 Speaker 1

Their LRO and Terry Saum, they voted to accept Rocky's own LRO as the Nevada LRO in a vote 21 to 0.

00:11:57 Speaker 1

and to quote, not recognize Terry Saum as anything in Nevada.

00:12:03 Speaker 1

A vote of 22 to zero.

00:12:06 Speaker 1

Their vote tallies changed.

00:12:07 Speaker 1

I don't know how that happens either, but they did.

00:12:11 Speaker 1

They say that her land recording office is in Washington state and doesn't represent the Federation.

00:12:18 Speaker 1

Even though for years and years and years, it has been declared that the LRO is a Federation organ, and it even has

the American State Assembly web domain in order to access it.

00:12:37 Speaker 1

As I just mentioned, three motions at one hybrid meeting drew 20, then 21, then 22 votes, throwing with each motion.

00:12:44 Speaker 1

The motion against Mike, me, got no recorded count.

00:12:50 Speaker 1

Their notices separate agreement sheet bears only about a dozen thumbprints.

00:12:55 Speaker 1

So what they said in their meeting was that let me see if I can find this here real quick.

00:13:00 Speaker 1

So you know.

00:13:04 Speaker 1

There was a motion on the floor to stop Michael Wilson and to inform him that he does not represent the Nevada people or the Nevada Assembly.

00:13:14 Speaker 1

They said that.

00:13:18 Speaker 1

I have never been elected to represent the Nevada Assembly and therefore.

00:13:23 Speaker 1

I'm a fraudulent office holder, apparently.

00:13:29 Speaker 1

I'll remind you guys, I was elected on May 30th of last year for a four-year term, so I've got three years to go and they're going to have to put up with me until I'm done.

00:13:40 Speaker 1

Signed and thumbprinted on June 14th.

00:13:43 Speaker 1

Now, I sent out a notice for them not to use the Nevada seal or their embossers that shows the Nevada seal.

00:13:54 Speaker 1

because that's Nevada Assembly property, and that they're not authorized by the Nevada Assembly to do that, to use those seals.

00:14:04 Speaker 1

I gave them 14 days to respond, and that expired on June 12th.

00:14:09 Speaker 1

And then we got a notice, a retaliatory notice from them on June 14th, where they asserted that the Assembly never voted to confirm Mike.

00:14:19 Speaker 1

and asked that he get more training before he becomes a militia commander and claimed his status paperwork disqualifies him.

00:14:28 Speaker 1

I don't know what that means either.

00:14:29 Speaker 1

I don't really care.

00:14:31 Speaker 1

They said they sent a cease and desist.

00:14:33 Speaker 1

They ordered Mike and Sue to stop issuing notices and stop representing the Nevada Assembly.

00:14:39 Speaker 1

This is an attempted breach directly into our jurisdiction and against the officers seated at the Assembly itself placed.

00:14:49 Speaker 1

Why is this of no concern for us?

00:14:52 Speaker 1

It's void.

00:14:54 Speaker 1

They hold no jurisdiction over a seat, the seated assembly elected.

00:15:00 Speaker 1

A body with no standing cannot unseat an officer it never seated.

00:15:06 Speaker 1

Their order stops at our boundary and it carries no force or no effect within our boundary, within our jurisdictional boundary.

00:15:16 Speaker 1

The Nevada Assembly is well established, and because they call themselves a Nevada Assembly Unincorporated, doesn't make them a Nevada Assembly.

00:15:27 Speaker 1

So their attempt to remove me is void on its face.

00:15:35 Speaker 1

So here's the big point here.

00:15:38 Speaker 1

A meeting is not a mandate.

00:15:40 Speaker 1

Gathering a few ASNs from Nevada in a room, taking a vote, does not create the assembly.

00:15:46 Speaker 1

Showing up is not standing.

00:15:49 Speaker 1

A show of hands is not a mandate.

00:15:51 Speaker 1

The authority to constitute an assembly derives from established processes, vetting, recording, election, not from a single meeting's enthusiasm.

00:16:02 Speaker 1

And here's the most important part.

00:16:05 Speaker 1

We've been here since 2019.

00:16:08 Speaker 1

We have all the records to prove it.

00:16:10 Speaker 1

The Nevada Assembly has been seated and operating since 2019, vetted members, recorded officers, continuous meetings, and documents of record.

00:16:20 Speaker 1

It cannot be re-founded by people who never left their chairs.

00:16:24 Speaker 1

The seat is occupied.

00:16:26 Speaker 1

It cannot be claimed by fiat.

00:16:30 Speaker 1

Theirs is peripheral.

00:16:32 Speaker 1

What they did is peripheral activity under a new label.

00:16:37 Speaker 1

It has no impact and has no effect on the Nevada Assembly.

00:16:40 Speaker 1

whether they choose to call themselves that or not.

00:16:47 Speaker 1

No mandate, no standing.

00:16:50 Speaker 1

Wanting it isn't having it.

00:16:53 Speaker 1

Wanting to be the assembly is not the same as having the standing to be it.

00:16:58 Speaker 1

There is no electoral mandate from the people on Nevada behind this group.

00:17:03 Speaker 1

Desire and declaration, however loudly proclaimed, do not substitute for process, vetting, or consent.

00:17:10 Speaker 1

And it's important to understand that in any government environment, if there is authority of any kind, which we say, rightfully so, comes from the people, it's by consent.

00:17:24 Speaker 1

You can't impose it on people who aren't present at your meetings, who don't recognize your declaration.

00:17:32 Speaker 1

There's no way for them to access us within our jurisdiction if they wanted to do it.

00:17:38 Speaker 1

More cleanly, more appropriately, they'd come to our meetings and they would express their desire to do this.

00:17:43 Speaker 1

They've tried that.

00:17:45 Speaker 1

And they were told to go away.

00:17:48 Speaker 1

That's why they're stomping around on the ground right now.

00:17:54 Speaker 1

The appointed not elected.

00:17:56 Speaker 1

No one in the Federation is elected by anyone in Nevada.

00:17:59 Speaker 1

Coordinators are appointed and here appointed without real assembly interaction or awareness.

00:18:06 Speaker 1

An appointment is not a mandate.

00:18:08 Speaker 1

It is a provisional administrative convenience, nothing more.

00:18:12 Speaker 1

So Tamara is appointed by the Federation as a coordinator.

00:18:18 Speaker 1

OK, big whoop.

00:18:21 Speaker 1

We've got now at least three on the state.

00:18:26 Speaker 1

We don't have to accept anything that a coordinator says unless the assembly accepts it.

00:18:34 Speaker 1

And we're certainly free to reject anything, that a coordinator says, if the Nevada assembly rejects it.

00:18:42 Speaker 1

Now you hear this term all the time.

00:18:43 Speaker 1

Fraud vitiates everything.

00:18:46 Speaker 1

That's a Supreme Court ruling.

00:18:49 Speaker 1

The claim with no mandate, with no genuine process is, in substance, fraudulent.

00:18:55 Speaker 1

And fraud vitiates everything it touches.

00:18:58 Speaker 1

A void act cannot seat an assembly over a people who never consented.

00:19:04 Speaker 1

What was never valid cannot be made valid by repetition or volume.

00:19:09 Speaker 1

I really want everybody to get this because I know some people are saying, well, we've got to do something to stop them.

00:19:15 Speaker 1

Actually, we don't.

00:19:17 Speaker 1

We'll get into that.

00:19:22 Speaker 1

Our name is ours.

00:19:23 Speaker 1

It's on the record.

00:19:25 Speaker 1

The certificate of assumed name was created in 2020.

00:19:31 Speaker 1

Recorded December 26, 2020, the Nevada Assembly owns the name and all derivatives expressly including the Nevada Assembly unincorporated.

00:19:41 Speaker 1

It's in the document.

00:19:44 Speaker 1

This is a matter of public record.

00:19:45 Speaker 1

This was recorded with a de facto records office in Clark County back in 2020.

00:19:54 Speaker 1

They clearly haven't done their homework.

00:19:57 Speaker 1

It's not a claim, it's a matter of public record.

00:20:02 Speaker 1

The rights that run into, and in that document, what it says is the first use around 2019 was recorded the rights traced back to October 31st, 1864 when Nevada became a state.

00:20:18 Speaker 1

So the claim was made in 2019 and it reverted all the way back to 1864.

00:20:24 Speaker 1

I don't think most of these people in Clark County who voted on this were even around then.

00:20:31 Speaker 1

Their claim rests on a single May 30 vote.

00:20:34 Speaker 1

The contrast in legal weight could not be any more stark.

00:20:38 Speaker 1

And I say legal because it's actually recorded in the legal system.

00:20:43 Speaker 1

It's also not lawful.

00:20:47 Speaker 1

We've enforced this already.

00:20:48 Speaker 1

We have the DMCA ruling about the dot land domain that they were using.

00:20:55 Speaker 1

It was determined by a third party

00:20:59 Speaker 1

policing agent, essentially, for the internet, international in scope.

00:21:06 Speaker 1

And they determined that their use of that domain was cybersquatting.

00:21:14 Speaker 1

So we address the name violations through a process.

00:21:17 Speaker 1

That's how we'll deal with it.

00:21:19 Speaker 1

And have a track record of prevailing.

00:21:21 Speaker 1

We will document this, that's what our job is.

00:21:26 Speaker 1

And they can jump up and down all they want, but it's not going to change the outcome.

00:21:29 Speaker 1

Hang on a quick second here.

00:21:36 Speaker 1

County versus state.

00:21:37 Speaker 1

So there's this other theory that's going on that the states or the counties are somehow superior.

00:21:42 Speaker 1

The union states are somehow superior to the state.

00:21:47 Speaker 1

Their whole theory is that the county outranks the state, so a county group can therefore declare itself the state assembly.

00:21:56 Speaker 1

This inversion is the load-bearing pillar of everything else they have done.

00:22:00 Speaker 1

Remove it and the entire structure collapses.

00:22:04 Speaker 1

In the Federation's 2019 General Assembly Handbook, it says the opposite.

00:22:09 Speaker 1

Assemble the state first.

00:22:12 Speaker 1

Land and soil are hand in glove, not a stack with soil on top.

00:22:18 Speaker 1

Their own cited sources refute their claim.

00:22:22 Speaker 1

Counties feed the states.

00:22:24 Speaker 1

Counties are constituent units of the state.

00:22:28 Speaker 1

States are members of the federation.

00:22:30 Speaker 1

County coordinators attend state calls as guests.

00:22:35 Speaker 1

This is all federation documentation.

00:22:39 Speaker 1

The hierarchy runs county, state, federation.

00:22:43 Speaker 1

The claim collapses on its own sources by their own rules.

00:22:48 Speaker 1

The states, I've heard Anna and I've read Anna's documents multiple times saying that

00:22:53 Speaker 1

The states and the counties are mutually dependent on each other.

00:22:58 Speaker 1

The counties can't function without the state jurisdictional boundary.

00:23:02 Speaker 1

And the counties function within their own county jurisdictional boundaries.

00:23:07 Speaker 1

The state doesn't go in there and meddle with their county stuff, which is why we're not doing anything to rein in this group on Clark County.

00:23:15 Speaker 1

Clark County has to do that.

00:23:18 Speaker 1

And I know for a fact Clark County has a whole lot more than 20 members.

00:23:22 Speaker 1

But right now, 20 members are making all the determinative decisions for the entire county.

00:23:28 Speaker 1

So for all you folks that are on Clark County, either live with it or get active and fix it.

00:23:34 Speaker 1

It's up to you.

00:23:38 Speaker 2

If I could, Mike.

00:23:40 Speaker 1

Go ahead, Keith.

00:23:44 Speaker 2

I'm loving your presentation, but the way I'm hearing this is they are actually in a state of insurrection against the governor.

00:23:56 Speaker 1

Well, I'm going to leave that to the others to determine.

00:24:01 Speaker 1

Insurrection is a very strong term and it's not an enforceable term by any stretch.

00:24:08 Speaker 1

We don't get rid of people.

00:24:10 Speaker 1

We don't tell them they can't be

00:24:12 Speaker 1

ASNs, for example, they've changed their status, they're ASNs.

00:24:16 Speaker 1

We've got a whole lot of people who are ASNs on the state and in other states that don't participate in the government at all.

00:24:24 Speaker 1

And we have decorum guidelines and other things that are coming out of the GPP to address behavior when you're in our meetings and how you conduct yourselves, but they're outside the meeting.

00:24:37 Speaker 1

They're doing something that is

00:24:42 Speaker 1

completely outside of our jurisdiction.

00:24:45 Speaker 1

So I don't really care about it.

00:24:49 Speaker 1

And there's only 20 of them.

00:24:51 Speaker 2

Yeah, I was just pointing out that what they're doing is a form of insurrection because they're negating how power flows in a state.

00:25:07 Speaker 2

And it comes from the governor down.

00:25:10 Speaker 2

not from a Podunk county or whatever it is, to the governor.

00:25:15 Speaker 2

And they've reversed it.

00:25:18 Speaker 1

They have reversed it.

00:25:20 Speaker 1

Their thinking is reversed.

00:25:21 Speaker 3

Mike, may I?

00:25:22 Speaker 3

This is Sue.

00:25:23 Speaker 1

Sure.

00:25:23 Speaker 1

Sue, go ahead.

00:25:25 Speaker 3

So the governor is in a different jurisdiction.

00:25:31 Speaker 3

But what they're doing is they're creating a duplicate assembly.

00:25:34 Speaker 3

And so by definition, that would be a district assembly.

00:25:39 Speaker 3

And, you know, I think the fact that they're separating themselves from the state assembly is almost like they're they're separating themselves from the Nevada assembly.

00:25:53 Speaker 3

So and the one other thing I would correct is the use of officers.

00:26:00 Speaker 3

We don't we don't have officers.

00:26:02 Speaker 3

I would maybe change that to volunteers, you know, we're elected and chosen.

00:26:08 Speaker 3

in a volunteer position and by the people and they think that that's a power position.

00:26:17 Speaker 3

For example, you know, I guess Tamara thinks that's a power position which gives her the right to exclude

00:26:25 Speaker 3

all the all the counties in the exempt assembly except for one or two and to conduct private separate meetings where you know the rest of the state isn't even informed about what is happening and I think the you know that it speaks to the intent when she was on the business meeting and didn't

So they seem to be befuddled and confused about even jurisdiction, primarily jurisdiction.

Outside it, what others do, votes they take, titles they give themselves, names they adopt, cannot bind us.

It has no effect on us.

Their acts stop at our borders and our boundary.

00:34:44 Speaker 1

We do not need to fight what cannot cross the battle line.

00:34:50 Speaker 1

Jurisdiction is the battle line.

00:34:53 Speaker 1

The membrane, so to speak, jurisdiction is a membrane between the two.

00:34:59 Speaker 1

We taught it in our January and March militia meetings when we talked about jurisdiction.

00:35:04 Speaker 1

It's not an abstract theory, it's well established, it's factual.

00:35:10 Speaker 1

And it's our practical armor.

00:35:13 Speaker 1

Tonight is the application of that.

00:35:16 Speaker 1

I know everybody wants us to go run down there and, you know, fix it.

Well, you know, you can't fix certain things, but you just have to let them run their course.

00:35:27 Speaker 1

They're not hurting us.

00:35:28 Speaker 1

They're not coming into our jurisdiction.

00:35:30 Speaker 1

When they do, by taking that name or by using our seals, they get noticed on it, whether they want to have any more notices or not.

But those notices serve a purpose.

They're documentary evidence of how we've addressed these situations.

And if it escalates more, we have the documentation to prove we gave them reasonable notice, we declared exactly what their concerns were, we gave them an opportunity to respond, they declined, and on it goes.

So here's what we do.

The tactic is to pull our energy away from the real work we do.
