**Our land jurisdiction is internationally enforced by Federal Marshals, not "US Marshals".**

**Federal Marshals = Continental Marshals = Land Jurisdiction Marshals.**

**US Marshals = Sea Jurisdiction Marshals.**

By 1791 all (3) **three levels of federal government** are present in addition to the **nation-states** governments

**National**(international land) = dba States of America

**Territorial** (international sea) = dba United States of America

**Municipal** (global air) = dba United States

- All three function in either international or global jurisdiction(s) that are **foreign** with respect to the actual **nation-states** of this country.
- The **nation-states** hold the **soil jurisdiction** of each state which underlies the **land jurisdiction** of the **country** as a whole.
- **The United States of America** holds **all** international and global powers **in trust** for the **nation-states**, either to **delegate under contract** or to **reserve as non-delegated powers**. It is our **National Trust**

# There are **four (4) styles of government** present

1. **Nation-states** have a **republican style** government
  - **States** are **republics**
2. The **States of America** was an **American organization** administering our international land jurisdiction
3. Territories have a **democracy**
  - The British dominated **United States of America** were limited to territorial functions
4. Municipal government is a **plenary oligarchy**
  - The Holy See's **United States** organizations were limited to municipal functions
